SEN has been helping PIs write grants, publish papers, and build their web presence for over 10 years. I think that we are a real help for young faculty in the early stages of their career, because of our experience writing a very large array of grants (RO1s, program grants such as PO1s, SBIRs, foundation grants, training grants). We can work one-on-one with individual faculty, or partner with academic departments or universities to design creative programs to support their faculty. Over the last two years, we designed two very exciting projects to support faculty success and retention with deans and department chairs at Stanford and University of Connecticut. We are reaching out to other universities to see if we can replicate the model elsewhere. Can you think of anyone who might be interested?
